

## ASL Studies Major Related Courses

In addition to the major specific courses, all ASLS students must complete at least 12 credits of Related Courses, at the 2000-level or higher, outside the ASLN program. Courses can come from areas of interest: Any modern or classical language, English, linguistics, philosophy or philosophy course; Any course that is directly related to second language acquisition is also allowed including any human rights course or any course covering disability related topics; Any history, political science, art history, anthropology, sociology, economics or geography courses that focuses on deaf culture or about people who are deaf. Any course that does not meet these specific requirements must be approved by the program advisor. Check the course catalog for possible prerequisites and cross-listed courses.
