

Teacher Certification Program for College Graduates (TCPCG)

The <u>Teacher Certification Program for College Graduates</u> (TCPCG) is offered by the Neag School of Education at UConn's Avery Point, Hartford, and Waterbury campuses.

This full-time, four-semester, 48-credit-hour certification and master's program begins in Summer Session I and continues through the subsequent academic year.

Certification Areas (for Grades 7-12, unless otherwise indicated):

- Agriculture (PK-12)
- English
- Mathematics
- Science (biology, chemistry, earth science, general science, physics)
- Social Studies
- Special Education (K-12)
- World Languages (American Sign Language, French, German, Italian, Latin, Mandarin Chinese, Spanish)

Course Schedule

Summer Session I and II (each session is six weeks): Mon. through Thurs., 9 a.m. - 3 p.m.

Fall Semester: Full-time student teaching, 12 weeks; Seminar Tues. or Wed., 5-7:30 p.m.

Spring Semester: Day and evening classes; 10-hour per week internship

How to Apply

TCPCG applications are accepted Sept. 1 - Dec. 1 for the program beginning the following summer. For details, visit <u>s.uconn.edu/teach</u>.

Requirements:

In order to apply, you must have completed:

- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution
 - 36 credits in the subject area in which you wish to teach (up to 12 related credits can be included for most subjects; see <u>program guidelines</u>)
 - A 3-credit survey course in U.S. history; see approved course list
 - 39 credits of general education courses, including courses in five of the following areas: English, natural sciences, mathematics, social studies, world languages, fine arts)
 - Application materials for your application to UConn's Graduate School

Prior to starting the program, students must pass the <u>Praxis II subject assessment</u> or <u>ACTFL tests</u> (World Language students).

Once **admitted** to TCPCG, students must take the Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators test, or else obtain a waiver. In order to waive Praxis Core, submit qualifying scores from the ACT, GRE, or SAT. <u>Learn more about the Praxis Core requirement and your eligibility for a waiver</u>. Please note: Although there are minimum passing standards, students <u>do not</u> need to achieve the passing score in order to enter TCPCG.
