Application

Instructional Assistants (IA's) assist faculty and provided tutorial support for students enrolled in courses within the ASL Program. In order to apply for this position, you must be an undergraduate student and have completed the course for which you would like to serve as an IA with a grade of B or better or a recommendation from one of the faculty within the ASL Studies Program. While no specific overall GPA is required, the IA is expected to be in good academic standing.

Based on performance, IAs are awarded a grade and earn 2 to 3 credits in lieu of compensation. Two credits require 6 working hours per week and three credits require 9 hours per week. Once approved for this position, you must register for ASLN 3292 Experiential Learning in order to receive credit. All IA's will receive a grade based partly on the self-evaluation upon completion of the course. The self-evaluation can be found in the Instructional Assistant Manual.

Students who either do not need or want credit and wish to benefit from the experience of working as an IA may opt to volunteer. Roles and responsibilities remain the same, however, volunteers will receive a letter of support and certificate of appreciation to add to either their portfolio or applications for employment or graduate school. Volunteers still need to submit an application.

Applications for any Fall and Summer positions must be submitted by the last day of March. Applications for any Spring positions must be submitted by the last day of November.
